# Americanism & Government Scholarship Test 2025 Test Dates: March 3-14, 2025

Students are given the opportunity to receive recognition and scholarships by taking an online test comprised of 50 multiple-choice, true and false questions followed by an essay question of 300 words or less. The program is endorsed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and is open to any Wisconsin student in the 10th, 11th or 12th grade. Scholarships are:

- 10th Grade- 11 \$250 Scholarships awarded
- 11th Grade- 11 \$300 Scholarships awarded
- 12th Grade- 11 \$750 Scholarships awarded

c) Emergency Preparedness, d) Family at Home, e) Keeping Communities Safe, f) POW/MIA Continuum, g) Readiness of the Unexpected, h) Somewhere World, i) Support Military at Home, j) Support Military Returning Home, k) Care of the Wounded, l) Communications. Being alert needs to be second nature, meaning it is somewhere close to you at all times.

What will be your plan if you are suddenly without heat or electricity. Do you have contact information to grab at a moment's notice?
