Grant Supports Local Therapy to Veterans

Mental health services are now readily available to veterans through a grant awarded to Highland Springs Counseling, by the State of Wisconsin. Highland Springs Counseling, LLC is located at 523 Main Street in Highland, Wisconsin and provides therapy to maintain and increase mental health, especially for those who have experienced trauma.

On May 1st, 2024, Secretary James Bond, of the Wisconsin Department of Veteran's Affairs (WDVA) was in Highland to present Highland Springs Counseling, LLC with the Emergency/Crisis Mental Health Treatment Program for Veterans Grant. This grant funds traditional therapy to maintain mental health well-being as well as crisis intervention programs. This therapy is provided at no cost to eligible Wisconsin residents who have served our country as military, National Guard, or Reserve members. Eligibility is not based on years served, and the reasons for therapy do not have to be directly related to active duty. Issues faced by veterans can include relationships and other life stressors.

Therapy can be offered in-person at the office, telehealth, or in-home for homebound individuals in the local area. Tricia Morzenti, the therapist at Highland Springs Counseling, is honored to serve the veterans who have served our country and communities. She values their sacrifice, courage, and determination.

ALA JUNIOR PATCH PROGRAM

Any Junior member of the ALA and school-aged Sons of The American Legion can be part of the Junior Patch Program. You don't have to have an active group to participate.

American Legion Auxiliary Junior members and Sons of The American Legion youth members can be active participants of the organization with the Patch Program. Regardless of where one lives, and whether she/he belongs to an active Junior group or squadron, Junior Auxiliary members and SAL youth members can serve their communities and veterans, and learn about patriotism, health, fitness, and leadership through this program.

Each sheet explains the criteria and what must be accomplished to earn a specific patch. When the activities are completed, an adult or Senior member must sign the form to verify that the Junior or SAL youth has met the patch criteria.

There are four levels of patch criteria:

- Purple Level: Pre-School through Kindergarten. Children of this age can earn the following patches.
 - Americanism: Educate yourself about the rights and responsibilities of an American citizen,
 - Membership: Your eligibility for membership is a gift from a veteran.



Poppy: The symbol of sacrifices our veterans have made.

For each of the above three patches, four of the seven possible choices must be completed to earn the patch. For example, to earn the Americanism patch, a member could recite the Pledge of Allegiance with an adult, color some pages in the ALA's *America the Beautiful* coloring books, draw a picture about what is important to them living in the United States and have an adult identify the proper number of stars and stripes on the American flag.

- Red Level: 1st through 4th grade, pictured below,
- Gold Level: 5th grade through 8th grade,
- Blue Level: 9th grade through 12th grade (or 18 years old).


