Is there anything more patriotic than serving one's country? If you saw the segment "In the Company of Heroes" premier during the recent Olympics, offering a view of Normandy, you know that through a special program, WWII veterans were flown overseas to relive, remember, and reconnect with those who have become their families. The same honor and respect these French families showed the veterans, was also shown by the veterans as they paid their respects at the gravesites of those they left behind so long ago.

Now in their 90s and 100s, many of our heroes were only 18 and 19, had never been away from home, and in their wildest dreams could not have imagined the journey they lived to share.

The episode was bittersweet – bringing tears to your eyes, pulling heart strings, and fueling a patriotic fire!

Americanism is on one of the four pillars of The American Legion. Units should be promoting Flag Day, Americanism in schools, Veterans in Community Schools, study of the U.S. Constitution, ALA Badger Girls State, scouting, the Americanism Essay Contest, observance of patriotic holidays, and history of the Pledge of Allegiance. Units are urged to participate and assist with The American Legion programs such as American Legion Baseball, American Legion Softball, Badger Boys State, the Oratorical Contest, Wisconsin American Legion Law Enforcement Career Academy, and Junior Shooting Sports. *A Unit need not do all. Simply pick one or several!*

The 2nd District Postcard Project continues...As members drive around town, have them note *houses* displaying the American flag, pull over to jot down the address; then *report* it to your Unit's Americanism Chairman or form a committee to handle this project. Be sure to keep an ongoing list so only one card is sent to a *residence*. Mail a thank you postcard. Keep it brief and to the point, signing off with American Legion Auxiliary and your Unit name and number.

Sample:

Dear Patriotic Citizen, Thank you for proudly displaying the American flag. Long may she wave! American Legion Auxiliary Pitterle-Beaudoin Unit189

While observing flags, you might also note any that should be repaired/replaced. The American Legion Flag & Emblem catalog offers flag replacement postcards at www.emblem.legion.org. The postcard is anonymous and has a well-written note. Item 735.200 is 60-cents each or take advantage of the special pricing of 25 cards at 50-cents apiece for only \$12.50. While perusing the catalog, why not check out some of the patriotic items you could gift students?

To compile a contact list, I've asked the County Presidents to connect with their Units for the names and email addresses (with attached form) of the Americanism Chairmen. If there is none, then the contact info for a designated member or the President would be appreciated. These should be returned no later than September 5th.

Reporting runs from April 1, 2024, through March 31, 2025.

If you haven't already done so, start tracking hours, monetary & in-kind donations, and activities.

It will be a much easier and quicker task when Year-End Reports roll around!
