

If your Legion counterparts don't understand, separate from them for awhile by meeting in a different location. Our Unit has a member that constantly causes Trouble with a capital T! This member is disruptive, rude and refuses to listen to anyone else's opinion. Everything must be their way or else! They are running off others that might be interested in joining us. Working projects is a nightmare. We can't suspend this member because a vote to do that isn't allowed; just because they are the President. What do we do?

Frustrated

I'd be frustrated, too! Leading is not synonymous with bossing. Have you tried talking with the president about leadership behavior? Other things to try: (1) Request that your parliamentarian do the job of keeping the president in line, mediating the meetings but not giving opinions. (2) Check the unit's governing documents to see if a set number of executive board members can call a special executive session. If that is allowed, get together with the president and gently but truthfully lay out the dissatisfaction with the current lack of leadership. This is not easy to do. (3) Ask the Department Leadership Team to attend a unit meeting to provide training before you lose too many members. (4) The next time elections come around, someone new needs to step up and run for president. Have a ballot vote for officers so members won't feel too intimidated by the president.



### **Auxiliary Emergency Fund**

The Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF) is a fund that provides temporary emergency assistance to eligible American Legion Auxiliary members who have endured a significant financial setback as a result of an act of nature or another personal crisis. President Becky Mueller has selected the AEF as one of her special projects and challenges every unit to donate \$1 per member.

Applicants must be American Legion Auxiliary (ALA) members and maintained ALA membership for three consecutive years (the current year and immediate past two years). Auxiliary Emergency Fund grants of up to \$3,000 provide immediate emergency assistance to ALA members in areas devastated by a natural disaster, such as tornado, flood, fire, hurricane, earthquake, or other severe weather. The applicant must have received damage to their primary residence and/or been displaced or evacuated from the residence and had out-of-pocket expenses for food, clothing, and shelter. Applications must be submitted electronically through the national website within 6 months of disaster and awards are limited to one grant per grantee in a 12-month period.

Funds requested through AEF related to the payment of medical-related expenses, taxes, general loans, insurances, credit cards, cellular/TV services, animal care, car purchase/payments, and/or home/vehicle maintenance/repairs are not applicable for review or funding consideration.

There are many, many organizations asking for donations and it is important to support the Auxiliary Emergency Fund (AEF). This is <u>direct</u> help from members to members in time of an emergency, for a Disaster Assistance grant or a Temporary Assistance grant. Some suggestions for raising funds are:

- Put raising funds for AEF on your agenda for the upcoming year.
- Challenge members to find fun new fundraising ideas.
- Pass the hat at one or more meetings with funds dedicated to the AEF.
- Have an AEF Chairman in your Unit.

As your Unit makes plans for the upcoming year, include fundraisers and donations to the AEF in your schedule. #### Greetings!

If you don't know me, I am Dany Thompson and I serve as the chairman of the American Legion Auxiliary Badger Girls State (ALABGS) Committee. In a few weeks we will be sending out information packets for the 2025 session, reflecting a price increase for the reservation fee to \$500, and I wanted to explain why.

First, the overall cost of the program has gone up, especially for renting the facility and providing housing and meals. Secondly, since the COVID pandemic, we have lost approximately 200 delegates. Pre-2020, our session hosted 700 delegates. Since 2022 that number has dropped to about 500 and we do not foresee increased participation without some help. With fewer participants, the cost per person has increased.

The total cost for each delegate who attends this week-long life-changing conference will be \$635 for the 2025 session. UW-Oshkosh's services are \$485 per delegate: \$230 for housing (\$46/night x 5 nights), \$113 for meals (14 meals), and \$142 for facility usage. Facility expenses include the cost of UW-Oshkosh administrative, janitorial and security personnel; usage fees for offices, meeting rooms, conference areas, athletic field, and auditorium; use of technology equipment/personnel, etc. Additionally, ALABGS needs to pay general operating expenses which include liability insurance, ALA HQ staff wages, audit fees, and program expenses such as citizens manuals, t-shirts, totes, pens, rental of copiers and golf carts, and volunteers' housing and meals.

The ALABGS Committee has worked hard to reduce our budget without affecting the delegates' learning experiences and are looking for alternate sources of funding to offset the difference between the reservation fee and the actual cost for a delegate. The ALABGS Committee is also requesting proposals from other colleges and universities in an effort to find the most affordable venue to host this program in 2026 and beyond, but we hope you understand the need to increase the reservation fee.

Please continue to sponsor a delegate (or more) to the session as we believe the mission of ALABGS is an important one for developing today's youth into future leaders. We encourage you to seek outside support from local businesses and civic organizations (Rotary, Lions Club, Elks Club, etc.) to make this opportunity available to students in your area.

#### **2025 ALA BADGER GIRLS STATE**

ALABGS information packets will be mailed in late October for the 2025 ALABGS session. Access to the National Membership database ALAMIS (American Legion Auxiliary Membership Information System) is available to TWO current unit officers/chairmen per unit. Subscription is for **read only** access to the individual's unit. Two officers/chairmen per unit may register for access but they must have their own individual e-mail address.

The database runs in real time so that you can get the most up to date information. Look up new member ID#'s, view and print current rosters whenever you need to, double check to see who has paid or not paid, and more.

Those more computer savvy will be able to manipulate the information to print mailing labels or send out mass emails. Microsoft Excel is the recommended program to utilize the more advanced capabilities of the system.

**Note- This is for read only access**; you will not be able to change names, phone numbers, email addresses, drop, decease, or transfer members etc., all these changes will still need to be submitted to Department Headquarters on a Member Change Form.

The subscription fee is \$10.00 per person per calendar year (January 1, 2025 thru December 31, 2025) for read only access and each person must be submitted on a separate form.

- 9. How did your unit work with Legionnaires, Sons and Riders to promote the Education Program?
- 10. In what ways did your unit achieve ALA's mission through the Education Program?

## Prepare the Veteran(s) and Students

In addition to sharing their experiences, veterans may also discuss a wide range of topics including how to help a family who has a deployed military service member, how to show support for the troops, proper respect for the flag, or why The American Legion Family was formed and what it stands for. Also, veterans' sharing of their military experience with an appreciative audience can help them heal psychological wounds from combat, deployment or family separation. Veterans who have spoken to students generally describe the experience as a rewarding and personally satisfying experience.

- Ask each veteran if there are topics they wish to discuss or not discuss. Work with the teachers to develop guidelines for students to respect the veterans' wishes.
- It is common for young people to want to ask a military service member if they have killed anyone.
   Teachers should discuss this in advance, requesting that students refrain from asking this question out of respect for the servicemember.
- Below is a list of potential questions and talking points to review with your veteran(s) in advance. It
  may even be helpful to assign questions to students at the event.
  - When and where did you serve?
  - Why did you join the service? What branch?
  - Why did you pick the branch that you were in?
  - What did it feel like to be in the service?
  - Would you demonstrate a proper salute?
  - What was boot camp like?
  - What were your job assignments?
  - What are some of your memorable experiences?
  - What did you do for entertainment?
  - Where did you travel during service?
  - Any humorous or unusual events?
    - What did you do in the days and weeks after you returned?
    - Did you form any close friendships, and do you still stay in touch?
    - Are you a part of any veterans' organizations?
    - Did your military experience influence your views on today's military and war?
    - How did the service affect your life?
    - What values and/or skills did you learn from your experience?

# Make Make a fun and safe night

Every October, children look forward to Halloween night – the time when they get to dress up as their favorite characters, knock on neighbors' doors and ask the age-old question: "Trick or Treat?"

Kids usually get what they want – a bag or bucket full of sweets! This joy can quickly sour, however, if parents and their children have not made the necessary preparations for everyone to have a safe night.

These tips are designed to help you, and your child, keep trick-or-treat safety in mind during Halloween. Please take the time to read the Halloween story, which incorporates safety tips, with your child. Together, we can make Halloween a fun and safe night for everyone.



Once upon a frightful Halloween night something wonderful happened - in all the towns and cities across the country, children had a fun and safe night of trick-or-treating.

This happened because mothers and fathers walked with their young daughters and sons as they collected their treats. Older children walked in small groups. Nobody went out alone. Everyone carried a flashlight or glow stick.

Each child knew their telephone number and home address just in case they got separated from the group. They knew how to dial 911 in case of an emergency. They knew never to go anywhere with anybody they didn't know or without permission from their parents or guardians.

Children stayed in their own neighborhoods and stopped only at well-lit homes. They knew better than to go inside any house, no matter what the person at the door said.

Everyone stayed on sidewalks or walked facing traffic and used crosswalks when available. They only crossed streets at corners, never between parked cars. All children obeyed traffic signals; they knew to stop, look both ways and listen for traffic before crossing.

Children wore light-colored costumes and added reflective tape to them, as well as their trick-or-treat bag, so they could easily be seen.

Children knew to accept only treats that were tightly wrapped or sealed and to wait to eat them until they got home so adults could inspect every piece of candy.

Children found that Halloween was much more fun when it was celebrated safely. And that night, children across the nation drifted

off to sleep dreaming of all their goodies, all the moms and dads slept soundly too.

Because parents took time to teach their children about Halloween safety and made sure the rules were followed, the children had a fun and safe night. And they lived happily - and safely - ever after.



#### Additional safety tips:

- Pin a piece of paper to the child's costume that features the parents' contact info in case of an emergency.
- Don't assume the right of way with traffic and always watch for vehicles backing out of driveways.
- Adhere to trick-or-treating hours in your community
- Have fun and be safe

When donating candy: Don't throw away excess Halloween candy! Ask your



local American Legion Auxiliary Unit or American Legion Post if they would like it. Many Units/Posts will put it in goody bags that they either send to the military women and men serving overseas or provide to homeless or hospitalized veterans.

The Poppy Program has had a support role in the American Legion Auxiliary since 1921. On Memorial Day and Veterans Day, millions of red crepe paper poppies are distributed across the country in exchange for donations that go directly to assist disabled and hospitalized veterans. Most of us recognize the Poppy as a symbol of strength, honor, sacrifice and as a special remembrance of all Veterans who served their country.

- 4. Crisis Communication. We are not immune to crises. When challenges arise, whether they are related to financial mismanagement, controversies, or unforeseen disasters, timely PR efforts can manage the situation and protect our reputation. #### **GET INVOLVED**

- 2. Support the therapeutic rehabilitation and healing of veterans through arts, crafts, and hobbies.
  - Donate to and promote awareness of the National Veterans Creative Arts Festival (VCAF).
  - Support Creative Arts Festivals at local VA hospitals with time, supplies, and money.
- 3. Support veteran caregivers, family members, and survivors.
- 4. Volunteer at local VA hospitals and veterans' homes.

  - Submit Service to Veterans hours award form to Department Headquarters to receive pins and hour bars.

- REPORTING VA&R reports offer an overview of work carried out for our veterans. Reporting is
  mandatory for every Unit. If possible, include photos of special projects. If your Unit is not
  involved in this program, say so. That will serve as your report.
- March 15<sup>th</sup>: Submit Service to Veterans Hours Award form to recognize eligible members with Service to Veterans pins and hour bars.
- April 1<sup>st</sup>: Submit Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Award Cover Sheet with narrative for judging as Most Outstanding Unit Veterans Affairs & Rehabilitation Program to the Department Chairman.
- To be considered for a national award, the unit must submit their entry with a National Award Cover sheet to the Department Chairman. The National Award Cover sheet will be posted on the department website (www.amlegionauxwi.org) under the Programs Info tab.

Assisting with light yardwork, home repairs, or housekeeping, sewing, cooking, crafting, running errands, rides to appointments, relieving caregivers, adopting a veteran or service member and family, organizing a Stand Down, Job Fair, Benefits Briefing, or Welcome Home event, assembling Care Packages, gifting Buddy Baskets, babysitting, visiting veterans, and recruiting more members with listening ears, caring hearts, and helping hands will be appreciated, make a difference, and serve the mission.

The ALA also awards volunteers when hour milestones are reached. At 50 hours, a pin and hour bar are provided. Hour bars are then awarded at 100, 300, 500, 1,000, and each thousand thereafter up to 20,000. The next bars are 25,000 and 30,000, On reaching 35,000, a Lifetime Service to Veterans pin is awarded.


