It is March Madness time and if you follow the Badger men's basketball team, it is an exciting time. Go Badgers. It is also an exciting and busy time for The American Legion. Post should be getting their "Of The Year Award" applications sent in. If your Post is submitting applications, they need to be into Adj. Denise by April 1st.

Every Post should have received a "Post Data Report" from headquarters. This report must be at Headquarters by April 9th. The information on this report is used by State Headquarters as well National. Make sure the information on this form is correct, especially your Post dues amount.

Be getting your Consolidated Post Reports ready to be sent in. They are due at Headquarters by June 1<sup>st</sup>. It is mandatory for every Post to send in the CPR report. Every Post does something throughout the year and it needs to be recorded and put on the CPR report. This information is used when our National Commander gives their report to Congress. If you have guestions on the CPR report, give me a call and I will work with you on getting it ready to send in. Accountability.

State Adj. Julie just sent out information on the A & G Testing. We do not have a list of winners yet, but we do have the number of schools that participated. Our 3<sup>rd</sup> District had 22 schools participate in the program with 179 students taking the test. The schools with the most students participating were DeForest, Mineral Point and Potosi. Out of the 12 Districts, the 3<sup>rd</sup> District had the second highest number of students taking the test. There is an opportunity for more than 22 schools participating in the A & G Testing. We need to make sure the schools and students are aware of the Scholarship Funds that are available.

We held our Oratorical Scholarship contest at the Marshall Legion Post on February 22<sup>nd</sup>. We had four outstanding students participate in the contest. Wyatt Erhardt-Dane County, Abigail Biank-Green County, Grant Kuberski-Lafayette County and Josie Lauper-Grant County. Wyatt was the District winner, and he will move onto the State Contest in Ripon on March 29<sup>th</sup>. Thank you to Marshall Post 279 for hosting the contest.

Good news from Grant County. We had two Posts that have been struggling, and they are working on their Membership and holding Post meetings. Beetown Post 551 has gone from 8 members to 13 members and they have plans to bring in more members. At this time, they are holding zoom meetings with 90% attendance. Hazel Green Post 526 had their first meeting in some time and there is excitement to get up and running again. They have temporary officers installed and they are looking forward to getting active as a Post and active in the Hazel Green community. The Membership numbers for the week just came out and the Hazel Green Post is now a 100% Membership Post. CONGRATULATIONS!! Looking for good things happening with these Posts. Thank you to Grant County Commander Alan McCormick and District Vice Commander JR Wilkinson for their work with these Posts.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> District has an opportunity to finish strong with our Membership, but it will take work. On February 21, 2025, the family of Mr. John and Dr. (DVM) Christine Ripley, known as Dr. Christine, experienced a house fire in rural Richland County where they and their two children, Ava, age 6 and Tyler, age 4, were residing.

The weather at the time of the alarm was approximately minus 13 degrees. Due to the distance and response time to the site and considering the bitter cold, Cazenovia Fire Chief, Darrell Slama, immediately summoned additional assistance from Richland Center Fire department and the Hillpoint Fire Department.

Upon learning of the Ripley family fire loss and impact to the family, Child Welfare Chairman Jim Hying and Chef de Gare Passe Sandra Kramer gathered information on the event by speaking directly with Dr. Christine.

After reviewing the Charles Ardery Child welfare guidelines with Dr. Christine, Voyageur Kramer personally accompanied Dr. Christine to the Kohl's Department Store on the west side of Madison, where Dr. Christine selected various articles of clothing to replace some of the fire losses her children experienced.

During our promenade on March 6th, Chef de Gare Passe, Sandra Kramer also asked the voyageurs in attendance if they would chip in and help buy a couple of toys for the children. She explained that to children that young of age clothes are ok, but toys are EVERTHING! One toy each has been ordered and once here will be delivered to Dr. Christine.
