You will speak to a real person. A member may pay for several people at a time; perfect for the grandparents that pay for several members. Once either payment has been accepted the member(s) will be sent a confirmation notice and NATIONAL WILL SEND THEM A VALID NATIONAL AUTHORIZED MEMBERSHIP CARD. It is up to your discretion if you choose to send them a unit card.

No more waiting on checks or the mail. Units are notified WEEKLY of their members that pay by either method or you can use your ALA MIS access to view them.
