Americanism & Government Scholarship Test - 2025 Test Dates: March 3-14, 2025

Students are given the opportunity to receive recognition and scholarships by taking an online test comprised of 50 multiple-choice, true and false questions followed by an essay question of 300 words or less. The program is endorsed by the State Superintendent of Public Instruction and is open to any Wisconsin student in the 10th, 11th or 12th grade. Scholarships are:

- 10th Grade- 11 \$250 Scholarships awarded
- 11th Grade- 11 \$300 Scholarships awarded
- 12th Grade- 11 \$750 Scholarships awarded

The test access button will be live after March 2, 2025, at wilegion.org/scholarships/

Units select from the submitted essays the top one from each category. Send only these top essays to DEPARTMENT CHAIRMAN by March 15, 2025.

The Americanism Essay Contest was created to teach students the value of patriotism and what it means to be Americans.

Students (grades 3 to 12) explore the fundamental rights and freedoms we enjoy today. Each year's contest has a different theme; one student in each category per division is awarded a prize. There is a category for students with special needs.

Current Essay Theme: "What does America the Beautiful mean to me (regarding veterans and our military)?"

Five hundred 25 thousand, six hundred minutes in a year. Not all veterans discharged after serving in the military resume their normal life before serving; and how do you measure the life of those veterans with five hundred 25 thousand, six hundred minutes?

I have an acquaintance who has his grandfather's military history professionally matted and framed hanging in his office. The collage incudes his grandfather's medals and bars, a pencil drawing of a B-17, the flag that was draped over his grandfather's casket and the telegram that his great-grandmother received informing her that her 19-year-old son who was a tail gunner on a B-17 was shot down and considered MIA. How many minutes did his great-grandmother pace the floor praying to God for the safe return of her 19-year-old son? How many minutes did the 19-year-old solider MIA keep track of his time while in capacity; by the sunlight, if he saw sunlight at all, by the darkness of the night?

How many minutes in a year did the homeless veteran sleep outside in the cold rain? How many minutes in a year did the veterans drink or use drugs trying to erase the haunting memories of their time in battle? How many minutes in a year did the veteran contemplate ending their own life before they pulled the trigger? In just one day, 22 veterans commit suicide.

As I write this article for "The Informer", I have 21,600 minutes left in 2024 trying to make better the lives of veterans. I still have time to contact the elected officials requesting additional funding for both physical and mental health care. I can continue my volunteer service at the William S. Middleton Memorial Hospital in Madison. I still have time to financially support the Badger Honor Flight and the Lone Eagle Honor Flight, and I can continue to write cards and letters to be handed out for the "mail call" for veterans on the 2025 Flights. I can donate food for the various food pantries serving our veterans.

You and I, we still have time in 2024 to improve the lives of our nation's veterans, but also for our active military and military families. In 2025, we will have five hundred 25 thousand, six hundred minutes to care for our nation's veterans, active military and military families.

Dear County and Unit presidents, I strongly urge you to promote the following conferences and meetings with the members within the Third District.

The Auxiliary's **2025 Mid-Winter Conference** is being held on January 18th in Appleton at the Hilton Paper Valley Hotel, registration fee is \$25.00 per person before January 2nd and \$30.00 after January 2nd. The Department has scheduled some very informative and helpful workshops. Special guest speakers will be from the UW MIA Recovery and Identification Project. So my next Google search of course was on the State of Wisconsin ALA Department website & under the Programs section and I found that our past Department President Joanie Dickerson is this year's PPP Chairman. The purpose of this program is to use the experience and knowledge of past Auxiliary leaders at all levels to train and encourage future leaders. All Units are all encouraged to establish a Past Presidents Parley group in our own local units. The dues are only \$7.00 per year for each Past President. Dues can be paid by the Unit or by the members.

The PPP is a standing committee of the American Legion Auxiliary. They promote the activities of the Auxiliary, with special consideration given to female veterans. Eligibility to membership in the PPP is based on two factors: 1) a member must have served as President of the American Legion Auxiliary on the unit, county, district, or department level, and 2) unit dues must have been paid for the current year. Please Note: If a president succeeds themselves in office, they are considered a past president after the end of their first term and may then join the PPP.

Among the projects that the PPP promotes is the "Mentor of the Year" Award. More information & application forms can be found on the department website.

Another program which the PPP program sponsors is their Scholarship Fund which awards three healthcare scholarships each year to qualified applicants in need of financial assistance to complete their education in Nursing and Healthcare fields. Any unit or individual member can also donate to this PPP Scholarship Fund.
