TIME MANAGEMENT

- Volunteer when you are available

- Volunteer from home

 - Knit, crochet, sew items for our Veterans
 - Do the "Well Check" Calls to your Unit members
 - Contact your Legislators on Veterans Issues
 - Ask the President if there is anything that you can help her with

TIME MANAGEMENT – AT MEETINGS

- Pre-Plan your Meeting Set up an Agenda
- Assign Agenda items to Program Chairman to present and discuss
- Allow members to electronically attend a meeting. (zoom or phone)
- Explain the Protocol rules at beginning of the meeting – you only speak when acknowledged by the Chairperson



What is Causing someone to feel outside of the group?

Ask yourself:

- Is it self-doubt or imposter syndrome?
- Is it a lack of shared experiences or interests?
- Is it due to external exclusion?
- Acknowledge that understanding the "why" is the first step to addressing the feeling.

Reframe your perspective



•Challenge Negative Thoughts:

- Avoid jumping to conclusions like "I'll never fit in."
- Replace with: "I'm still learning how to connect here."

Many people feel this way at some point. How can we overcome this feeling?

Time to take Action

- 1. Start Small
- Look for one-on-one connections.
- Compliment or ask questions about shared interests.
- 2. Be Proactive
- Join activities or discussions to increase interaction opportunities.
- Volunteer to help with group tasks.
- 3. Develop Skills
- Practice active listening.
- Learn to pick up on social cues.
- 4. Be Patient
- Building relationships takes time.

HOW TO FOSTER AN INCLUSIVE UNIT/DISTRICT

Why Inclusion Matters

The Benefits:

- Strengthens relationships and trust.
- Encourages diverse perspectives and innovation.
- Improves overall group morale and productivity.

• The Risks of Exclusion:

• Can lead to alienation, disengagement, and turnover (LOW MEMBERSHIP).

Identify and Tackle the Barriers to Inclusion

Common obstacles:

- Unconscious bias.
- Cliques and unintentional exclusivity.
- Lack of effort to engage newcomers or outsiders.

When you try to fit into a group of people you don't know very well and they accept you for who you are



A Community of Volunteers Serving Veterans, Military, and their Families

Inclusion is everyone's responsibility

1. Be Aware of Your Behavior

- Use inclusive language.
- Avoid interrupting or dismissing others' ideas.
- Make an effort to involve quieter members.

2. Create Opportunities for Interaction

- Organize icebreakers, group discussions, or team-building activities.
- Encourage collaboration on projects or shared goals.

We are all Leaders here

3. Actively Listen

- Show interest in others' ideas, backgrounds, and experiences.
- Avoid making assumptions—ask questions and clarify.

4. Celebrate Diversity

- Acknowledge and appreciate different perspectives, cultures, and skills.
- Highlight individuals' unique contributions.

5. Lead by Example

- As a leader (formal or informal), model inclusive behavior.
- Address exclusionary behaviors when they occur.

But where do we start?

• In Meetings: Rotate who speaks first and encourage everyone to contribute.

• In Social Settings: Look for people on the sidelines and invite them in.

• In Decision-Making: Seek input from a diverse group to ensure all voices are heard.

IT might not always be easy

- If Someone Resists Inclusion: Focus on the benefits for everyone, not just the excluded person.
- If You Make a Mistake: Acknowledge it, apologize, and learn from the experience.
- If Inclusion Feels Hard: Remember, small, consistent efforts can create meaningful change over time.




